About the Project and Program Status

1. The Beginning of the Extension Center:

The dream of SKC Extension Center Dum Dum came into reality that after much work and tirelessly working in the Center was used to utilize for purpose for the deprived and marginalized children. They belong to the poor families living at Rail Gate No.2 Dum Dum Cantt. and at the Cow shade (Khatal). Survey of the children was done in these two areas. About 25 School going children, dropouts and new comers were eager to learn and were interested to have tuition. Seeing the future of these children the step



was taken by Seva Kendra Calcutta entrusted to Ursuline Sisters at Dum Dum Cantonment to begin the tuition for these children.

2. The Purpose of the Project:

- The project would focus to the education of deprived and marginalized children ensuring that they have access to develop their talents and knowledge through tuition classes and different activities.
- This would also encourage and motivate them to continue their studies through Government schools instead of dropping out of the school.
- To bring awareness on health and hygiene and value education.

3. Inauguration of Tuition Centre:

 On 10th of April 2022, the SKC Extension Center was inaugurated with 25 children at 4.30 pm.
It was begun with prayer to God through the



intercession of St. Mother Teresa for the success of Extension Center Dum Dum. Sister Pratiti gave the introduction about Center. The purpose and moral values were told to make them familiar with one another. Children were very excited to begin their studies. They enjoyed dancing, singing and playing games after the inauguration.

- The project focused to the education of children at Seva Kendra Calcutta Extension Centre Dum Dum situated at Nalta School Road, Kumarpara ensuring that the children had access to develop their talents and knowledge. This encouraged and motivated them continue through Government schools instead of dropping out of the school. The underprivileged of this area were given daily tuition by experienced teachers. They were provided books, study material that they were not in a position to afford. The education process involved them to learn Spoken English as well. The health check-up and health education were provided periodically to ensure their well-being.
- Regular classes were conducted at Extension
 Centre from 10th April 2022. The attendance
 fluctuated with average No. of 10 to 15. In the beginning, one teacher and two Sisters conducted the
 classes in two different groups one in the morning at Rail Gate No. 2, and the other in the afternoon at
 Extension Centre Dum Dum.

Learnings, Challenges faced, and Solution:

It had been an experience of hope and learning about the background of caste, creed and culture of two different groups of students and families.

Challenges and Learnings	Solution
From the first day the racial difference was noticed that two groups did not mix with one another. Children from Rail Gate 2 did not join the tuition from 2 nd day itself.	Divided the group in two. Tuition is conducted at the door step for the children of Rail Gate No.2.
Number of children decreased drastically from 25 to 10-15. The reason is either parents are not interested, not willing to send children because of distance, from Rail Gate 2.	Some parents have arranged tuition for their children with private teachers.

Children from Rail Gate No.2 go working in the morning to empty garbage from flats, earn little money for themselves and support the family. Parents too go to work as domestic workers cleaning, swabbing, empty garbage as private / MCD employees.	A few joined the turion in the morning group at their doorsteps.
School going children get off from their School around 4.00PM. There is little time for their refreshment	Even then a few come to the SKC-Ext Centre for tuition
Children are active at the same time a few are difficult to control. They are slow in learning, take less interest.	Moral values and good behaviours are taught and often reminded.
Most of the time women at Rail Gate No. 2 defend themselves by making noise and quarrel begins in the area.	Constant visits and counselling have lessened the problem.
Families live in small huts; drunkard husbands give trouble any time.	Counselling has brought les noise and trouble.
There is a need of 24 hours security guard at Extension Centre. The place does not seem to be safe to keep anything in the building.	Met Mr. Robin Daria the Councillor of Ward No. 7 and his staff talked about the problem also gave in writing. Visits of two staff and their assurance is appreciated.
There is lack of space for outdoor games and exercise as well as indoor activities.	Managing with less space and what is available.
Every now and then garbage is dumped at our approach road to the building.	SKC - Ext Centre Staff does the needful.
There was no water supply in the building, Water reservoir needed repair, no electricity connection in rooms.	On 10 th May 2022 Mr. Subhash with Apu visited the building and the site, fixed Tulu Pump and water pipes, changed taps, cleaned the Water Reservoir, gave connection for water supply in the toilets and the kitchen. Electricity connection is given.

| Impact:

It had been an experience of hope and learning about the background of caste, creed and culture of two different groups of students and families at Dum Dum Extension Centre. Concerns and Challenges are numerous. Many go for private tuition soon after the schools are closed. Monthly and weekly Tests are good to know their improvement. Families when visited are very hospitable, friendly, show willingness to send their children to the Centre. The Centre is open daily. Total cleaning of the building is done bimonthly besides daily swabbing of the classroom.

'Never lose heart, hope for better.' Having this inspiration awareness building is done by visiting children and parents as often as possible.
